


DID YOU KNOW?

Henry Leland, a former manager of the Cadillac division of General Motors, formed The Lincoln Motor Company in August 1917. Leland named the new company after Abraham Lincoln, his hero and for whom he cast a vote in 1864. Lincoln's first source of revenue came from assembling Liberty aircraft engines, using cylinders supplied by Ford Motor Company.



After the war, the Lincoln factories were retooled to manufacture luxury automobiles. The company encountered severe financial troubles during the early 1920s and was bought out by Ford Motor Company in 1922. The purchase of Lincoln was a personal triumph for Henry Ford, who had been forced out of his second company by a group of investors led by Leland.










Rick's Pick



I am currently reading <u>The Eye Of Heaven</u>, by Clive Cussler. It came out in September of this year. The story is written with the characters Sam and Remi Fargo. They find Viking ships and evidence the ships sailed to Mexico and even to Colombia, South America.

Cussler has written over 249 books since 1965. His books have been published in more than 40 languages in more than 100 countries. His is most famous for his continuous series hero, Dirk Pitt, who first appeared in 1973.

Cussler writes books mostly for the royalties which finance his underwater searches. He is an internationally recognized authority on shipwrecks and founder of the National Underwater and Marine Agency, (NUMA) a 501-C3 non-profit organization (named after the fictional Federal agency in his novels)

that dedicates itself to preserving American maritime and naval history. He and his crew of marine experts have discovered more than 60 historically significant underwater wreck sites including the first submarine to sink a ship in battle, the Confederacy's Hunley, and its victim, the Union's Housatonic; the the U-20, the U-boat that sank the Lusitania; the Cumberland, which was sunk by the famous ironclad, Merrimack; the renowned Confederate raider Florida; the Navy airship, Akron, the Republic of Texas Navy warship, Zavala, found under a parking lot in Galveston; and the Carpathia, which sank almost 6 years to-the-day after plucking Titanic's survivors from the sea. NUMA turns over all artifacts to state and Federal authorities, or donates them to museums and universities.

In addition to being the Chairman of NUMA, Cussler is also a fellow in both the Explorers Club of New York and the Royal Geographic Society in London. He has been honored with the Lowell Thomas Award for outstanding underwater exploration. Cussler often inserts himself into his novels as an obscure boat captain saving the day.

FRESH APPLE CAKE

1 1/2 Cups Cooking Oil
3 Cups Plain Flour
1 Teaspoon Salt
1 Teaspoon Soda
1 Teaspoon Cinnamon
2 Cups Sugar
3 Eggs


Teaspoon Vanilla

Cups Chopped Apples
Cup Chopped Pecans

Topping

I 1/2 Cups Brown Sugar

1/4 Cup Evaporated Milk
I Stick Of Butter
I Teaspoon Vanilla



Cream oil and sugar; mix flour, salt, soda and cinnamon together; add to oil and sugar. Mix well. Then add eggs one at a time; add vanilla, apples and nuts. Pour into a 14"x10" greased baking dish. Bake in a pre-heated 350°F oven for 35 to 45 minutes.


For the topping:

In a sauce pan bring to a boil and boil for one minute. Pour over the cake while warm.

ORANGE CRUSH POUND CAKE

Teaspoon Vanilla Flavoring

| 1 | Cup Crisco | <u>Glaze</u> | |

| $2^{3}/_{4}$ | Cups Sugar | 3 oz. | Cream Cheese |

Cream crisco, butter, and sugar well. Add eggs one at a time and cream each egg well. Mixing well at this stage is what gives pound cake some air and makes it rise high.

Rotate, adding a little orange soda with flour. Mix after each until smooth. Add the orange and vanilla flavorings and do the final mix.

Bake at 325°F for one hour and 10 minutes in a well-greased and floured 10" tube pan.

For the glaze:

Cream butter and cream cheese. Mix in sugar and flavorings. Mix well. Spread on warm Orange Crush Cake.

RECYCLING GUIDELINES

Mixed Paper and Cardboard: Includes magazines, bulk mail, phone books, newspapers, etc. Please flatten boxes and remove all non-paper packaging such as Styrofoam. No pizza boxes with heavy grease or cheese residue accepted.

Paperboard:

No heavy wax covered paper accepted, such as orange juice or ice cream containers.

Aluminum Cans, Foil and Pie

All are accepted if free of food

Steel Cans and Scrap: All are accepted. Please do not put in your garbage can.

Glass jars and bottles: (clear, brown, blue and green)

No ceramic items, no window glass, no drinking glasses or mirrors. These items can ruin an entire load of glass!

Plastic Bottles and Jugs Anything with a neck. Do not accept plastic bags or wide-mouth containers such as yogurt cups, butter tubs or take-out boxes.

Other items accepted:

- Vehicle tires (limit 4 per person)
- Used books
- · Cellular phones-the city participates in the Cell Phones for Soldiers Recycling Program.
- Greeting cards
- Batteries (all types)
- Grinding of the Greens: Recycle your Tree: Trees can be placed at the curb for collection. Trees and trimmings are ground into mulch at Twin Chimneys Landfill.
