DID YOU KNOW?

The Model T, also known as the "Tin Lizzie," changed the way Americans live, work and travel. Henry Ford's revolutionary advancements in assembly-line automobile manufacturing made the Model T the first car to be affordable for a majority of Americans. For the first time car ownership became a reality for average American workers, not just the wealthy.

The Model T was built from 1908 to 1927. It was offered in several body styles, including a five-seat touring car, a two-seat runabout, and a seven-seat town car. The engine generated 20hp and propelled the car to modest top speeds of 40–45mph. The 10-gallon fuel tank was located under the front seat. Because gasoline was fed to the engine only by gravity, and also because the reverse gear offered more power than the forward gears, the Model T frequently had to be driven up a steep hill backward. As for color, Henry Ford used to say, "You can have any color you want as long as it's black."



On May 26, 1927, Henry Ford drove the 15 millionth Model T off the assembly line at his factory in Highland Park, Michigan.



Churn in one-gallon hand crank or electric ice cream churn.



The Gold Coast is about the North Shore of Long Island. Here two men are destined for a collision when a mafia don moves in next door to a wealthy, old money Wall Street lawyer. You will enjoy John Sutter's wit as he gets to know his new neighbor, Frank Bellarosa, and see how his wife Susan plays into the story.

The Gate House is a continuation of the story 10 years later when John returns to the death of someone close to him—in the same area as where his now ex-wife resides.



The Lion's Game and later book The Panther, both set in New York, involve a terrorist, known as Asad Khalil, who meets up with New York Policeman John Corey and his FBI wife, Kate Mayfield. Both of these stories will keep you riveted to your seat as you read them.



DeMille was born in Queens in New York City in 1943; four years later, his parents moved to Garden City, on Long Island, to raise their four boys.


